The name Indianapolis has proudly graced three previous vessels in our nation's Navy and demonstrates a century's heritage of naval tradition. The USS *Indianapolis* (ID-3865) transported valuable supplies to Europe in the aftermath of the First World War. The cruiser USS *Indianapolis* (CA-35) served with distinction in the Pacific theater for over three years during World War II before she was sunk in action on July 30, 1945. The USS *Indianapolis* (SSN-697), a Los-Angeles class submarine, served out the final decade of the Cold War and helped usher in the new era of naval heritage and dominance.
